Position: Assistant/Associate Professor in Hospitality and Tourism Management, 9-months, tenure-track, full time. Qualified candidate at the Associate Professor level may be eligible for the Anne Stegner Endowed Professorship.

Responsibilities:

- Actively publish in peer-reviewed hospitality and tourism journals and disseminate results to appropriate professional forums.
- Teach and develop a wide range of hospitality undergraduate courses.
- Advise undergraduate students and actively participate in program activities.
- Participate in outreach, which includes university service and professional associations.
- Develop liaisons with business and industry.
- Support the NDSU land-grant mission of teaching, research, and service.

Qualifications:

Minimum

- Earned doctoral degree in hospitality and tourism management (or closely related field), from an accredited university. ABDs will be considered, but must submit a letter from dissertation committee chair stating expected date of completion/defense. ABDs must have terminal degree by August 15, 2018.
- Demonstrable expertise in hospitality management through teaching, research, or industry experience.
- Potential for scholarly competence and ability to perform academic research. For Associate Professor, an established line of study with evidence of research productivity and a record of publications in peer reviewed academic journals.
- Evidence of effective college-level teaching and experience in developing instructional materials.
- Prior industry experience in hospitality or related fields.
- Evidence of effective oral and written communication skills.
- Ability to interact and collaborate effectively with a diversity of colleagues and students.

Preferred

- Research or teaching focus in at least one of the following: hospitality accounting and cost control, revenue management, service management, event management, or food and beverage management.
- Effective utilization of classroom technologies and hospitality and tourism specific software.
- Prior experience with curriculum development, academic advising, and involvement with student organizations.
- On-line teaching experience.
- Documented use of experiential learning pedagogies.
- Prior experience in mentoring undergraduates in research.
- Active participation in professional organizations.

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
