ROLE of the POSITION

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas William F. Harrah College of Hospitality will be searching for a full-time, 9-month Assistant Professor-in-Residence in Events Management. This is a non-tenure track teaching position that involves instruction primarily at the undergraduate level, although there may be the opportunity to teach graduate classes. The standard teaching load is 4 courses (12 credits) per semester. This faculty member may also be involved in delivering executive education, professional certificate programs, and online offerings.

The successful candidate hired with faculty in residence appointment develop a strong and impactful teaching portfolio focused on delivering course outcomes through comprehensive learning assessments and community engagement. This faculty member may be responsible for teaching courses in Event Management in one or more of the following subject areas: MICE (Meetings, Incentives, Conventions, Expositions), and the development of courses in Sporting Events and Entertainment Events. In addition, the candidate will engage in department, college, and university service activities. The position will reside in the department of Food, Beverage and Event Management. The anticipated start date is July 1, 2025.

PROFILE of the COLLEGE
