The chair will be appointed for a five-year term, beginning no later than Fall 2025. We seek an innovative and dynamic leader with a vision to advance the department's research and teaching while enhancing its national and international reputation and visibility. This is a tenured appointment, at the rank of full professor.

Applicants should have a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree in hospitality, tourism, sport or related area; a vision for leading the department and promoting its continued growth and success; a distinguished record of scholarship; a commitment to excellence in instruction; and the ability to work cooperatively and effectively with faculty, professional staff, and the administration. The chair should be able to advocate effectively for the needs and interests of the department, foster a climate of collaboration and collegiality within the department and across programs, and support the scholarship and professional development of the department's faculty. The chair should also demonstrate a commitment to interdisciplinarity and to building and furthering ties with industry and with other units across the College and the University. Founded in 1743, the University of Delaware (<u>www.udel.edu</u>) combines tradition and innovation, offering students a rich heritage along with the latest in instructional and research technology. Lerner College has five departments, 42 academic programs, about 4,200 students, 160 faculty members, and state-of-the art facilities. Lerner College supports full-time, part-time, on-site corporate, and online MBA programs in addition to MS programs in functional business areas and non-degree executive education programs.
